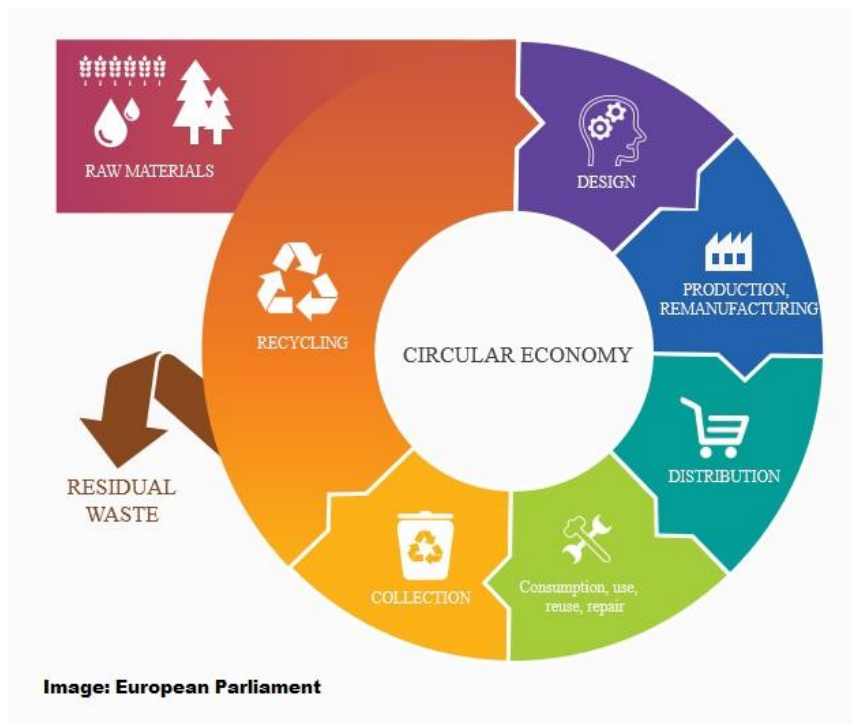


Monaghan Tidy Towns Community Circular Economy Action Plan (CCEAP)

“Waste Not, Want Not”

Introduction:

The circular economy is a model of production and consumption, which involves sharing, leasing, reusing, repairing, refurbishing and recycling existing materials and products to ensure that the life cycle of products is extended for as long as possible and in so doing reducing waste to a minimum.



Monaghan Tidy Towns (MTT) seeks to encourage the people of Monaghan to become a circular community - a community where waste is avoided and where materials are upcycled and reused.

MTT accessed support from Community Foundation Ireland (CFI) to develop a circular economy plan for Monaghan Town.

This plan is supported through the Circular Economy Fund set up in 2019 under Community Foundation Ireland’s wider Environment and Nature grant-making to encourage sustainable practices in communities across Ireland.

“The mission of the Circular Economy Fund is to invest strategically to raise the profile of circular economy, support the development of skills needed to effectively engage with issues associated with sustainability, and ensure that organisations working in this space are supported to continue their work.”

CFI partnered MTT with a consultant to guide us through the stages of Mapping, Inventory, Inquiry and Planning in the development of our Community Circular Economy Action Plan. Kathryn Mc Cabe from VOICE Ireland facilitated the development of our plan supported by seed funding to get started on community engagement as well as some recommendations that emerge.

The aim is to raise the profile of the circular economy and advance the education and awareness of sustainability initiatives in our community.

Across all 3 meetings there was a wide variety of community members present, eight to ten consistently.

The Plan

In developing our plan, we discussed previous initiatives (see Appendix 1) and experiences. Participants in the group had watched the series of videos produced by Voice Ireland as an introduction to the key concepts of the circular economy.

Vision Statements

During the consultation period participants devised a number of statements regarding what they wanted to achieve:

"Our vision is that all people in our community are able to waste not and want not."

"There are enough resources on this Earth for everyone's needs, but not everyone's greed."

“We recognise a culture and values shift is happening and that overtime we are learning to value a worklife balance, connections within our local community and to nurture nature, for all our wellbeing.”

“We will educate people on existing repair or waste recycling services. We will connect up those who need with those who want to share.”

Supplementary Statements:

- *Changing values for a future world; slow down, buy less, buy used, buy local, be thrifty*
- *Look to the past to plan for the future*
- *The future can be better if we work together now*
- *A better standard of living - not shop till you drop*

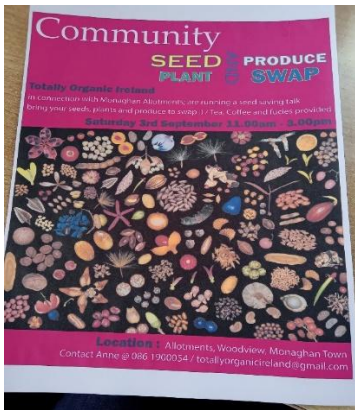

	<p>Mullaghmatt Cortolvin Community Development Company supports the employment and progression for people distant from the labour market through the operation of a furniture recycling facility. This facility accepts unwanted second-hand furniture, refurbishes and sells it on to locally disadvantaged individuals and families within the local community. Staff have undertaken ETB courses on upcycling furniture.</p>

Project name: Re-useable water cups for runners / joggers


Monaghan Tidy Towns and Monaghan County Council jointly purchased 3000 reusable branded plastic cups for Monaghan Town Runners. MTR uses these cups and lends them out to other running clubs for sporting events thereby replacing the need to buy hundreds of environmentally unfriendly plastic bottles. They have eliminated plastic waste to the tune of c 2500 plastic bottles at their major races annually. Used for races such as the 10 Miler in August, the Crocus 5k in March and at the Monaghan park-runs on Saturdays.



Project name: Monaghan Allotments

	<p>The allotments in Killygoan, the Community Garden in Mullaghmatt and the Sage Garden at the Grange bring involvement from the community in and around the estates, Rehab, National Learning Network, Scouts, migrants and many more. Work is also provided and supervised for Community Service and probationers.</p> <p>Rainwater is harvested from nearby roofs, there is a state-of-the-art wormery, a biodiversity area, a herb garden, an orchard, a hedgehog haven and an insect hotel to name just a few features.</p> <p>Native hedging has been planted along the fence borders. Upcycling of pallets and other materials is the order of the day and all of the garden sheds have been constructed using same. Native trees and hedging, apple and other fruit trees have all been added annually.</p>

<p>Monaghan Men's build bird and bat houses and plant fruit trees among many other things.</p>	

<p>Food Pantry/Community Fridge- Stop Food Waste and cost of living support</p>	
	
<p>With the support of Monaghan County Council, Teach na nDaoine bought a freezer to help support their food rescue system, with food donated by Tesco and also from the local shop which is a community not for profit shop. The shop is also participating in a food waste reduction project with Monaghan County Council. Through analysis of stock versus waste, food waste is being reduced at the deli counter. People can make appointments to access the pantry and all dealings are confidential.</p>	
<p>Award trophies</p>	

Trophies for our own local awards night were entirely made from recycled materials – bicycle chains, nails, screws and other pieces of metal. They were all themed for each award and completely unique.



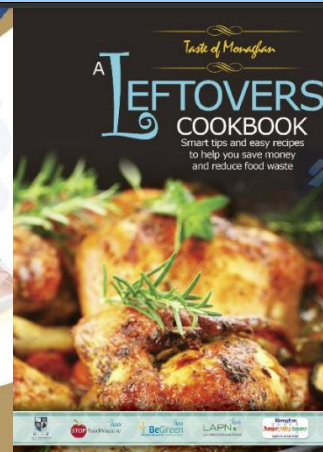
Sustainability stall at Food Festival

We teamed with the council to sponsor a chef for this year’s Street Food Festival on the theme of Stop Food Waste. We distributed Stop Food Waste information and our recipe booklet for leftovers. The recipe booklet was created for our Junior Tidy Towns group to distribute at previous festivals.



Project name: Keep Cup Campaign	
<p>We ran a Keep-Cup campaign whereby everyone bringing a reusable cup could a free draw to win €200 worth of Monaghan Town vouchers. Seven outlets including convenience stores and restaurants assisted.</p> <p>We made branded keep cups available at a reduced price for customers.</p>
